Bad Weather Blues

Does your dog balk at going outside to do his business when the weather is frightful? Chances are you would too. What can you do? You can dress your dog for the weather; a Newfie may be right at home in the snow, a Greyhound is a different story. If your dog hates the cold, put a comfortable coat on them. You may even try boots too, though, they take getting used to. If your dog hates booties, consider Musher's Secret. Musher's Secret is made up of a dense wax that protects your dog's pads from ice and snow. We are expecting a new shipment soon, so give it a try! Sometimes, all your dog needs is some company, so go outside with your pet. If you go out, bring an umbrella big enough to cover you and your dog. Make sure your dog is not frightened of umbrellas. If there is a lot of snow, shovel a path and a designated "potty" area for your pooch. This will help them navigate the snow, and be easier for you to clean too. Have you seen the video on YouTube where a family built a snow maze for their dogs? Make pottying in snow fun by making a maze! Check out the video below. If you have other dogs, have them all go out at the same time. Once one goes, the other will follow. If you have a small dog that simply will not tolerate the cold, you could train it to use a litter box. Just make sure the cat is okay with this. I do not recommend pee pads or "fire hydrant & grass pads." Your dog will get trained using these methods and may not retrain in warmer temps.
