This alerts Cay if they stray, so she can bring them back.

Fresh Breath Shamrocks

Ingredients:

1 cup whole wheat flour

½ cup rolled oats (quick cooking)

1 egg

½ cup all-natural applesauce

2 TBSP fresh minced parsley

½ TBSP fresh minced mint leaves

Mix all ingredients in bowl. Make into a patty and cover with wax paper. Refrigerate for an hour. Roll out on a well floured surface or between two pieces of wax paper. ¼- ½ " thickness.

Use a shamrock shape to cut out cookies. Bake at 350° for 15 minutes until set. Cool.
