

Denali Dogs

As I was researching sled dogs, I found something fascinating and was so surprised I did not know of this. Denali National Park, in Alaska, has had sled dogs in its service since 1921! The dogs are not considered a particular breed of dog, but often are called Alaskan Huskies or just sled dogs. These dogs are bred soley for performance. Each park ranger is assigned seven sled dogs. These dogs aid the ranger in the winter months with patrolling the vast 2-million-acre park. In 1936, the park was officially granted protection and funding for the 50 or so dogs in their service. Since that time, they have had their own kennel and breeding program. A new litter of puppies is born in the summer to keep the line going. They have a puppy cam, a blog, and you can follow the dogs on Facebook. In the winter, there is a map where you can track the dogs on their assignments throughout the park. The dogs are one of the most popular attractions at the park, getting about 50,000 visitors in the summer season. You can even adopt a retired dog ranger, if you meet the park's strict standards. All dogs are retired when they reach 9 years old. You can read more about these amazing dogs here.

If your furry friend needs a new sweater or coat, Home Goods, in Old Saybrook, has a large selection in all sizes.


