Safe Play

Sometimes when dogs play, they can get mouthy or over excited and that could mean disaster. If your dog has a play date or goes to the dog park, here are some safety tips to remember. If your dogs are in a safe, contained area, have them play "naked." That means no collars, harnesses or leashes. Certainly, you should never allow your dog to play with any training collar, such as a choke or prong. It's very easy for dogs to get tangled or worse, choked, by their own collar. Sometimes a tooth can get stuck in a collar, and that is very scary for the dog and you! Both you and the dog could suffer injuries. If you feel they must have their collar on, make sure that it has a quick-release buckle. In the event that the worst happens, and two dogs are stuck in their collars and are struggling, it does not hurt to have some tool that has cutting capabilities. Of course, you should always have a first aid kit in your home and car.


