


Do you dress your dog up for the weather or just because? Sometimes, it's fun to dress up your pup. Just make certain your dog's movement is not inhibited in any way. In winter, our New England weather can be frightful. We need to protect our pups from the elements with sweaters, coats, and booties. You can find dog apparel at almost any store that carries pet products, and on-line. There is even breedspecific apparel. If you have a puppy, older dog, or a short or no-haired dog, they will need something to keep them warm. With my older dogs, under 32 degrees, I put them in a coat for walks, especially when there is a breeze. My dachshund, who is often cold, wears a sweater in the house and a warmer coat for walks. My dogs never got used to boots, so I make certain their pads are protected with paw wax, such as Musher's Secret. Only you know what's right for your dog when the weather gets "ruff." Here's a DIY video on making your own paw wax for your dogs.



# Heads and Tails


Pucks and Paws night on January 24, at the Hartford Wolf Pack hockey game. Bring your leashed pup to watch the game. There will also be pet adoptions.


